In 3 of the 4 years preceding the global pandemic Zanzibar tourism saw y-o-y growth > 15%, with a 400% increase from 2010 to 2019. Despite the global travel restrictions travel to Zanzibar has remained robust, taking only 2 years to recover to pre-pandemic levels



Zanzibar has limited accommodation options for international travelers. 





LOCATION


- Kizimkazi-Mkunguni, bucolic fishing village in the Menai B Conservation Area

- Limited competition in the area as Kizimkazi is relatively underdeveloped compared to other locations in Zanziba


